Can you think of times when you saw good or bad consequences to things you did? Then read Deuteronomy 4:31. (Thank God for His mercy!)

### *Chimp Room – 2 year old*

Genesis 1      God's Creation

### *Faithful Fish, 3 year olds ~ First Hour*

We learned today that Jesus had picked three disciples and one of them was Philip. Philip went to tell his friend Nathanael. Philip and Nathanael went to see Jesus. When they got to Jesus, Jesus said to him "Nathanael you are a good man who loves God." Jesus knew his name. Read more about the story in John 1:43-49. Jesus knows your name also.

### *Faithful Fish, 3 year olds ~ Second Hour*

Luke 10      Mary and Martha

Mary and Martha were sisters. Jesus was their good friend and when he came to town he came to see them. Mary would spend time listening to Jesus, Martha was too busy thinking about the work she needed to do. Jesus tells Martha that Mary is doing something very important and that was listening. How many times are we too busy to listen?

### *Kingdom Kids, 4 year olds through Kindergarten ~ Second Hour*

Mark 7:31-37      Jesus Cares for a deaf man

We learn how Jesus cares for us. Some people bring a deaf man to Jesus. They knew that Jesus cared. Jesus takes the man away from the people and touched him and healed him. Who brought the man to Jesus? What was wrong with the man? What did Jesus do?

**Bible Verse:** This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. 1John 3:16.
