CONSEQUENCES...What are consequences? If you look both ways before you cross a road, you will not get run over (good consequence!)...but, if you don't look both ways, you may be run over by a garbage truck (bad consequence!). You see, most everything we do has a consequence, whether good or bad. Has your mom ever said something like, "You need to clean your room. If you get it cleaned up in an hour, we will go to the park. If you are not done in an hour, we are not going to the park?" Your mom made it very clear to you that if you did the right thing, there would be good consequences (the park). If you do not do the right thing, there would be bad consequences (no park). This is exactly what God did with Israel in Deuteronomy 11 and 28. He very clearly explained to His people that there would be good consequences if they obeyed and very bad ones if they disobeyed. He told them these things because He loved them so much and wanted to bless them.

Can you name 3 good consequences God promised if Israel obeyed Him with their whole hearts?

Can you name 3 bad consequences if they chose to disobey God?

Talk together about some time when you saw good or bad consequences in your family. Maybe Mom and Dad can tell some stories about when they faced some consequences.

As a family, ask God to help you to choose to obey Him so you can receive all the good blessing He has waiting for you!
