We are pausing our series to recap through some of the Ten Commandments we already covered. This week we are discussing what the last six commandments are about and how they relate to the second greatest commandment Jesus gave us in Matthew 22:39, “Love your neighbor as yourself.”

As a family, read Exodus 20:12-17 and Matthew 22:34-40 and answer the following questions:

1. What did Jesus say is the greatest commandment in Matthew 22?
2. What does Jesus say is the second greatest commandment?
3. What did we discuss last week about the first four commandments?
4. What are the last six commandments about? Why are they important?

Last week we talked about how the first four commandments are about our relationship with God. This week, we are turning our attention to how the last six commandments talk about our relationship with each other. Jesus explained that the second greatest commandment was to “Love your neighbor as yourself.” As we read the last six commandments, we see that God wanted Israel to love each other and treat each other right. That same principle applies hundreds of years later when Christ commanded that we love our neighbors.
