Hello from the Mzawa Church staff! Mzawa Church is currently finishing our series on the Ten Commandments in Exodus 20. The final week is going to cover how the laws God gave were meant to lead us all to the cross. This week, our scripture focus will be in Romans 3:20, “The more we know of God’s laws, the clearer it becomes that we aren’t obeying them; his laws serve only to make us see that we are sinners.”

As a family, read Romans 3:20 and answer the following questions:

1. Think back on all the commandments we’ve covered. What commandment in Exodus 20 is the toughest for you to follow? Why?
2. Read Romans 3:20, what does it say the law does?
3. If the law only helps recognize how dreadfully sinful we are...what did God do to save us from our sin issue?

As we close our Ten Commandments series we learn that the law reveals to us just how sinful we really are! We all have sinned and no matter how hard we try, we simply cannot follow the law perfectly. This is why the Ten Commandments lead us straight to Christ. Someone had to take on our sins and wipe us clean which is exactly what Christ did when He died and rose again! This is not a free pass for us to simply disobey God because our sins can be washed clean. God still calls us to faithfully obey Him, but when we mess up, Christ’s sacrifice allows us to be forgiven.
